

Andrew lived the better part of two years in Nepal where he followed a 17th century pilgrim's guidebook to research spiritual sites around the lower Himalayas. He has worked as assistant manager and book buyer for East West Books in Manhattan, and for Snow Lion Publications in Ithaca, NY. He wrote *Learning Practical Tibetan* (with MP3s) for Snow Lion. In Seattle, he opened his own bookstore, Infinity Books, in Pioneer Square, where he hosted many public events, including appearances by renowned Tibetan lamas, Hindu saints, and Zen masters. He moved to Los Angeles and wrote *How to Practice Vedic Astrology* (with CD-ROM) for HarperCollins, subsequently published by Inner Traditions.

The author's Asian travels, personal history, eclectic interests, and ways of dealing with challenging situations add an important context for the story of how the author and the cats came to enrich each others' lives. This was a fun read about a "slice of life" about which I had no prior awareness: Who knew that colonies of feral cats inhabited our cities?! And who knew that there are networks of people who care so very deeply?!

Feral cats became a major thread in the author's life. He makes them and their very difficult lives real and compelling. It is fascinating how he moved from feeling neutral about cats to loving them and wanting to make their lives better.

I enjoyed a new perspective on the care of feral cat colonies. I cried in the sad parts, was a little frustrated that it took so long for the author to get with the whole TNR program; but I share the love of a colony of feral cats. My experiences have been somewhat different as predators are usually not protected in my area, and "barn cats" are frequently kept for rodent control. But, I do know the miracles, joys, and sorrows that come from letting these felines into your life.

Lovely, funny book about caring for feral cats. I care for a colony myself and I much appreciated the wit and compassion with which Bloomfield told his story. I strongly recommend this book to all cat lovers, especially my fellow feral cat caretakers!
