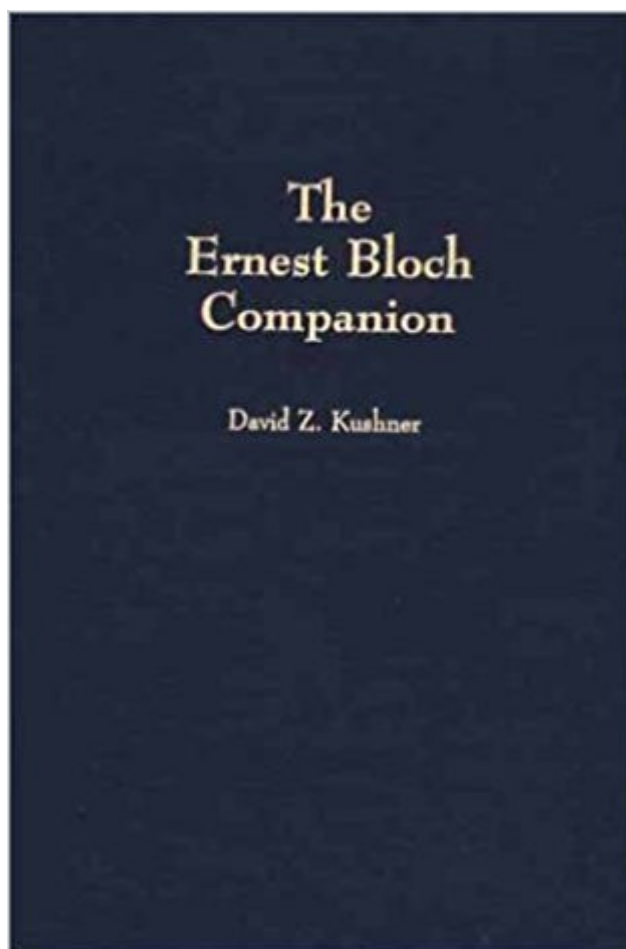


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# The Ernest Bloch Companion



## Synopsis

The evolution of Ernest Bloch's music is traced throughout his travels in Europe and America. A complete picture of Bloch emerges from this integrated study of his life and his music. The biographical information provides the framework for addressing the Jewish Question, a common focus of Bloch's work.
