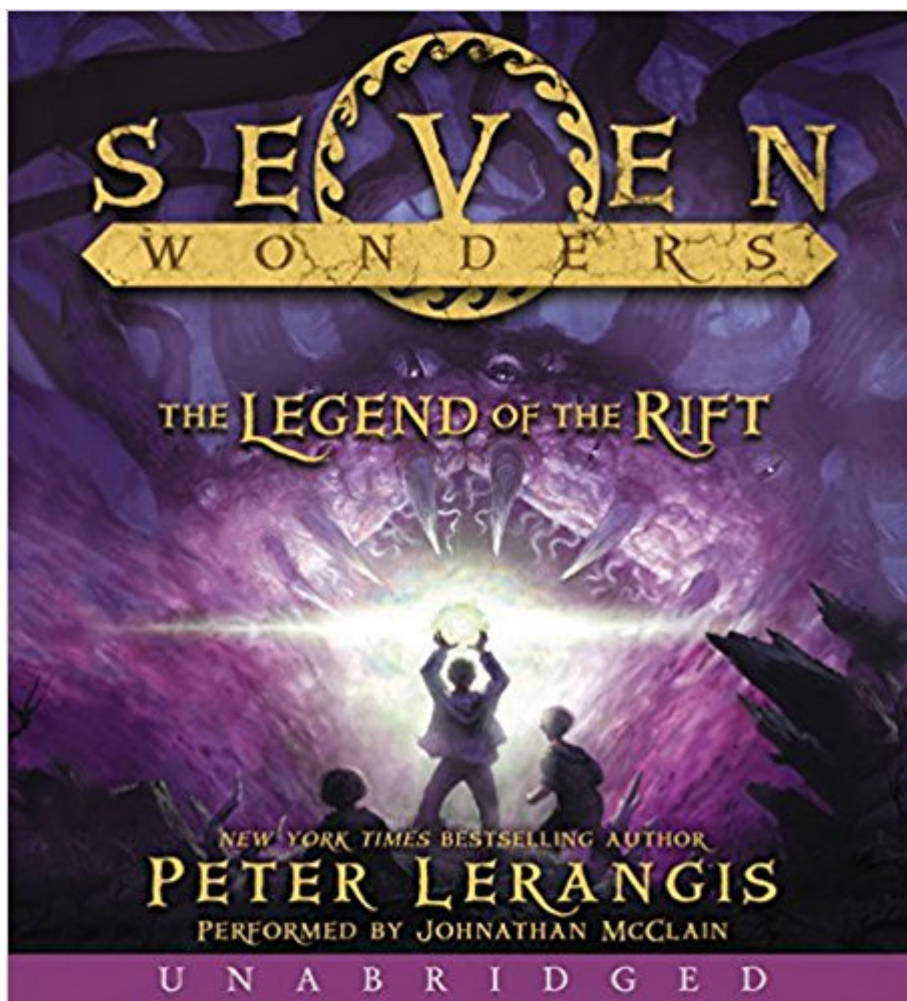


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Seven Wonders Book 5: The Legend Of The Rift CD

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Peter Lerangis is the author of more than one hundred and sixty books, which have sold more than five and half million copies and been translated into thirty-three different languages. These include the first four books in the New York Times bestselling Seven Wonders series, The Colossus Rises, Lost in Babylon, The Tomb of Shadows, and The Curse of the King, and two books in the 39 Clues series. I actually missed the release date by 24 hours, which amazed me. I thought I had pre-ordered! That's because of how much I enjoyed the first four books in the series, you see. This book takes up about half a second after the fourth book ends, and things are looking pretty grim for our hero and his friends. They're all about to die, one way or another, unless . . . Okay, I won't spoil that bit. If you haven't read any of these, just start with number one and work your way up. There are several shorter works, set in the world of ancient Atlantis, that have come out between these five novels. As the author says in the afterword, it's a tough world to leave, and I'll miss it. But, life goes on. At least I can report that it goes on with the Seven Wonders series available for anyone to read, and that is truly awesome!

I would rate this a 5 star series, I only have read 2 series that made get goosebumps and start crying, The Rangers Apprentice, and this one. I cannot explain how much this book has made me feel and it makes me terribly sad to know that The Legend of the Rift is the last one. I would recommend this book to young readers and even adults, this series is just a great read for any age. :D
