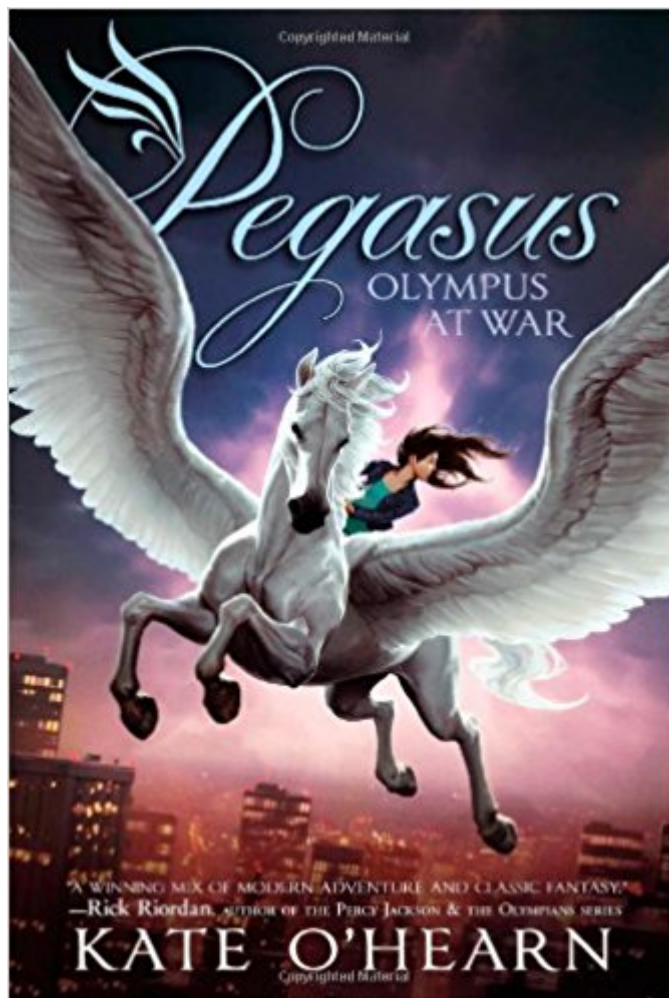

Please bear in mind that there is an American publisher for the Pegasus series, and the original English publisher. What has happened is the US series is just being released by Simon & Schuster - and they have changed the covers and titles. As the author, I had no say in this, nor did they do this to cheat my readership. I would also like it to be known that I love these new covers and titles; it is thrilling to finally see Emily on Pegs. However, it is unfortunate that some people have bought the English edition and now believe the US editions are the follow-on to the series. They are not. Here are the English titles and the US titles for each book in the series: Book 1 - English: Pegasus and the Flame Book 1 - US: Pegasus: the Flame of Olympus Book 2 - English: Pegasus and the Fight for Olympus Book 2 - US: Pegasus: Olympus at War Book 3 - English: Pegasus and the New Olympians Book 3 - US: Pegasus: The New Olympians February 19th - Update!!!! I can now reveal the US title for book 4... Please remember, it WILL have a different cover from the UK editions. I myself can't wait to see it! Book 4 - English: Pegasus and the Origins of Olympus Book 4 - US: Pegasus - Origins of Olympus August 9th - Update!!! Here is the title of Pegasus 5 - Remember, there are UK and US editions... Book 5 - English: Pegasus and the Rise of the Titans Book 5 - US: Pending Once again, I
