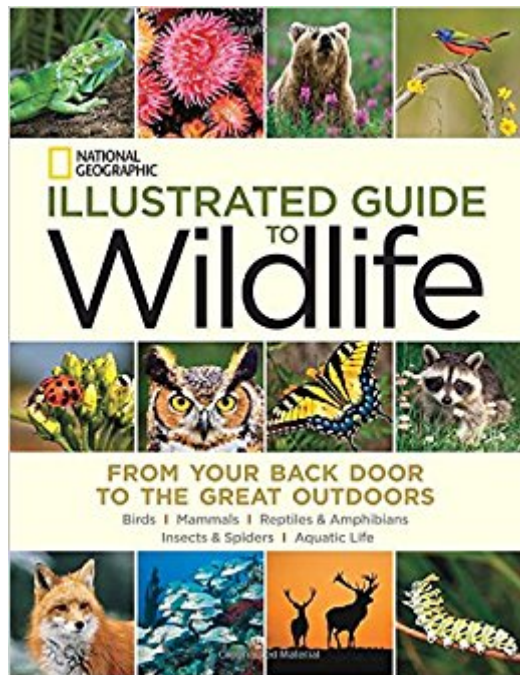

I looked at the book before I wrapped it and wanted to order another copy for myself right away (I haven't yet, but I still might)! Based on the reviews I thought it looked really interesting, and it reminded me of a nature encyclopedia I had when I was a kid. I love the presentation of little third or half-page quantities of information on a subject, in the context of related information (a little bit of fascinating information on a fox, and then more information on another animal). I think as a reader (adult or child) it gives you something to come back to over and over, providing a solid network of information that you can eventually build more on (if you choose to do more digging in additional resources). And the photography is beautiful. My sister (the mother of one of the nephews) said she could hardly put it down, and that her son loves it too (he's 8 years old).
