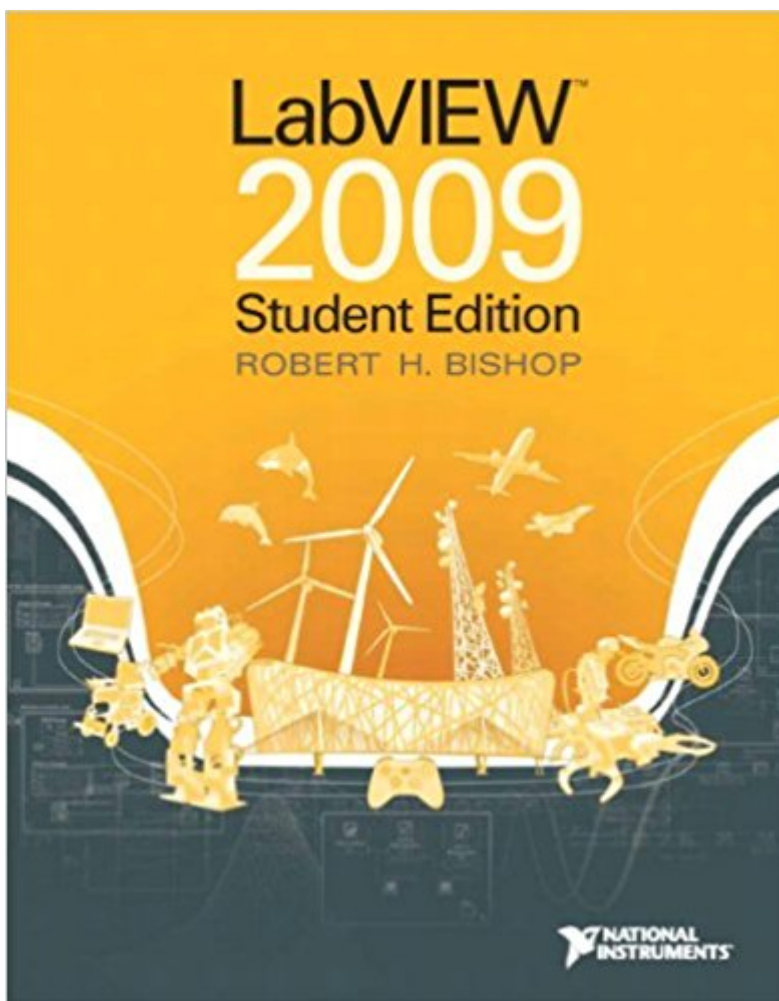

Synopsis

There are numerous screen captures in each section taken from a typical LabVIEW session. The figures contain additional labels and pointers added to the LabVIEW screen captures to help students understand what they are seeing on their computer screens as they follow along in the book. A directory of virtual instruments has been developed by the author exclusively for use by students using Learning with LabVIEW and is available on www.pearsonhighered.com/bishop. These virtual instruments complement the material in the book. In most situations, the students are asked to develop the virtual instrument themselves following instructions given in the book, and then compare their solutions with the solutions provided by the author to obtain immediate feedback. In other cases, students are asked to run a specified virtual instrument as a way to demonstrate an important LabVIEW concept.

I should have read the other reviews more closely before purchasing this. It WILL NOT WORK ON WINDOWS 7. Also NI doesn't want to support it. They are puzzled that anyone is still selling this software. All they want to talk about is LV 2012, and they recommend buying it from "On the hub". You can download an eval version from there to verify it will work for you before you waste your money on it. NI has never been an easy company to interact with. They are paranoid about giving you copies of training materials, even after you've spent thousands of dollars for the training classes that the materials are used in. Their business model appears to lean more heavily on making money running training than actually selling their software.

I am currently taking a class to learn how to use this program, but even without the course the book could be used by itself. Well worded and informative chapters with helpful examples and practice problems ranging in difficulty. Comes with the student version of the software and downloadable samples that are extremely useful. Some of the problems are challenging, but the website for the program has great forums as well.

I have contacted NI and Pearson for help, so far to date the support from NI has been good, they tried to get updates, etc, but still cannot use it on Windows 7, ironically the support site for NI states that Labview 2009 professional works on Windows 7, but I cant spend that much money on the professional edition.

First of all, the NI Labview system appears to be fantastic. Absolutely no problems on installation, and none in operation. With this backdrop, the book is excellent as well. I am using it for self-paced education, and it is working well. The problems and examples are clearly described. It is easy to use Labview while working through the chapters.
